

## The 16-19 tuition fund 2021 to 2022 academic year

At Vandyke Upper School we will use the funding to support identified students to attain their English Language and Maths GCSE grades at least Grade 4, to support their transition into Level 3 study to enable them to achieve well and to help to prepare them for adulthood by offering them opportunities to develop their employability portfolio, investigate destinations and to apply for their next steps. The English Language group is likely to be 8 students (2 groups). The Maths group is 4 students. The Functional Skills group is 2 students. Mentoring will be delivered on a one to one basis. All other workshops have been designed for delivery in groups of no more than 5. Students who will receive this support have been identified because they have not yet achieved their English Language or Mathematics grade 4 (or 5) and they are either economically disadvantaged, LAC, or SEND and therefore vulnerable to underachievement as a result of lost learning during the pandemic.
